# INTERNATIONAL PROGRAM



## MORIOKA TRIP

Student leaders, Steve and Jazz, attended an International Education Forum in Morioka, Japan last term. The theme of the forum was 'Education in 2030'. Seaford Secondary College were one of two Australian schools to attend, along with students from the following countries: Malaysia, Russia, China, Senegal, South Korea, New Zealand, Canada, Vietnam, Indonesia, Taiwan, Thailand, Finland, Japan, Indonesia and Argentina. Whilst in Morioka, Seaford Secondary College formed a sister-school agreement with Morioka Chuo High School.

## RITSUMEIKAN STUDY TOUR

Seaford Secondary College has been host to 11 Year 9 students from Ritsumeikan Junior High School for 2 weeks this term. Ritsumeikan Junior High is located

just outside of Kyoto, around 4 hours train from Tokyo. The 11 students at Seaford Secondary College are only a small group of the total 234 students who have travelled to Adelaide and been placed across 16 different schools. This is Ritsumeikan's compulsory grade 9 trip and along with these students are 16 teachers, school nurse, head teacher and deputy principal. Ms Julie Cooper and other specialist teachers at Seaford Secondary have worked exceptionally hard to ensure our visitors had a memorable time, enjoying lessons at school and on excursions to Adelaide city, the South Australian Museum, Central Markets, Cleland Wildlife Park and Port Noarlunga for aquatics.
