Operation Flinders Expedition.

Last term SILC students participated in Operation Flinders Exercise Four. The trip, from September 14 – 21, was supported by Teacher, Issy and Youth Worker, Mark and saw 9 of our young people venture around 700km north of Adelaide to Yankaninna Station on Adnyamathanha land in the far northern Flinders Ranges.


Students worked hard to raise around \$4000 with a couple of Bunnings BBQ fundraisers, a boot camp with Mark from Absolute Edge Personal Training where \$500 was donated along with other events supporting the cause.

The 7 day trek saw the team (Tango 10) cover over 80km with days of northerly winds and temperatures in the mid 30's and perfectly calm star filled nights. Participants carried all equipment daily in backpacks weighing around 20kg and then slept on a roll out mat under our "hoochie's" and the glow of the Milky Way each night. All cooking was done by camp fire and some of the meals were outstanding with one students potato bake on the last night an absolute highlight. One night we experienced some dreaming stories around the campfire with Auntie Dulcie and Auntie Judy and the Governor of South Australia, Her Excellency, The Honourable Frances Adamson AC, also stopped by to share the experience. We also climbed and abseiled a 30 - 40 metre cliff and also climbed two of the properties highest peaks Yadala Mora (770m) and Mount Rose (920m).

Our Team Leader, Smithy and Assistant, Nikki provided incredible guidance across the inhospitable country where even the prickles have prickles and there were also plenty of team building activities along with time for reflection on who we are and where we are going. The team's motto became "Do the work!" and in combination with the Operation Flinders line "One step at a time" is strong advice for all to consider when presented with a challenge.

Thanks to all who supported the expedition, it is greatly appreciated by staff and students who participated, especially Operation Flinders and the Adnyamathanha people.

As a reciprocal agreement, the schools listed above send one student to Mishima, Japan, each April school holidays. While in Japan, students live with a Japanese family, attend school at NUMSHS and participate in cultural excursions. 


